SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT

CEMENT MASONS AND PLASTERERS HEALTH AND WELFARE TRUST

This is a summary of the annual report of the Cement Masons and Plasterers Health and Welfare Trust (EIN 91-1106482, Plan No. 501) for the year beginning April 01, 2022 and ending March 31, 2023. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Board of Trustees of Cement Masons and Plasterers Health and Welfare Trust has committed itself to pay all medical, dental, vision, time loss benefit and prescription drug claims incurred under the terms of the plan.

INSURANCE INFORMATION

The plan has insurance contracts with Willamette Dental Of Washington, Inc., The Union Labor Life Insurance Company, United Healthcare Insurance Company, and Lifemap Assurance Company to pay certain Dental, Stop loss, life insurance, and prescription drug claims incurred under the terms of the plan. The total premiums paid for the plan year ending March 31, 2023 were \$2,038,498.

Because the contract with Willamette Dental of Washington, Inc. is a so called "experience-rated" contract, the premium costs are affected by, among other things, the number and size of claims. Of the total insurance premiums paid for the plan year ending March 31, 2023, the premiums paid under such "experience-rated" contract were \$321,313 and the total of all benefit claims paid under such "experience rated" contract during the plan year ending March 31, 2023 was \$229,558.

BASIC FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$31,766,957 as of March 31, 2023, compared to \$30,620,251 as of April 01, 2022. During the plan year, the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$1,146,706. This increase included unrealized appreciation and depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. During the plan year, the plan had total income of \$21,586,784, including employer contributions of \$20,307,720, participant contributions of \$1,522,705, net depreciation of (\$1,375,931), earnings from investments of \$649,988 and other income of \$452,302.

Plan expenses were \$20,440,078. These expenses included \$1,608,686 in administrative expenses, \$17,039,439 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries, and \$1,791,953 in benefits paid to insurance carriers for the provision of benefits. (Administrative expenses include administration fees, investment fees, auditing fees, attorney fees, banking fees, consulting fees and miscellaneous expenses).

You have the right to receive a copy of the full annual report, or any part thereof, on request. The items listed below are included in that report:

- 1. An accountant's report;
- 2. Financial information and information on payments to service providers;
- 3. Assets held for investment;
- 4. Transactions in excess of 5 percent of the plan assets; and
- 5. Insurance information including sales commissions paid by insurance carriers.

If you request a copy of the full annual report from the plan administrator, these two statements and accompanying notes will be included as part of that report. The charges to cover copying costs given above do not include a charge for the copying of these portions of the report because these portions are furnished without charge.

You also have the legally protected right to examine the annual report at the main office of the plan, 7525 SE 24th Street, Suite 200, Mercer Island, Washington 98040, and at the U.S. Department of Labor in Washington, D.C., or to obtain a copy from the U.S. Department of Labor upon payment of copying costs. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

To comply with the Department of Labor instructions the nonvested accumulated eligibility credits of \$10,179,218 and \$7,458,771 were not included in the Form 5500 at March 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively, and have not been included in this Summary Annual Report. The exclusion of the accumulated eligibility credits increased net assets, reflected in this Summary Annual Report, at March 31, 2023 and 2022 by \$10,179,218 and \$7,458,771, respectively, and increased the benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries, reflected in this Summary Annual Report, by \$2,720,447.
